

Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Program

The Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) program is a federal/state partnership designed to provide low-interest loans to public water systems for capital improvements aimed at increasing public health protection. Washington's DWSRF program is jointly managed by the Department of Health, Public Works Board, and the Department of Commerce. The Board approved over \$100M in new loans for the 2013 application cycle.



The Board executed their first DWSRF loan this year with Rocky Point Community Club, located in Snohomish County. The project will replace distribution pipeline, improve system reliability, and increase water supply by reconnecting the existing back-up well.

Staff from the Department of Health and the Public Works Board completed statewide site visits to review loan terms and agreements, financial impacts to the user, loan procedures and cultural review. Site visits were well received and a mutual learning experience!
