

Washington Infrastructure Information Portal (WIIP)


DEMONSTRATION PROJECT

The Public Works Board and the Department of Commerce obtained funding to develop a demonstration product to obtain infrastructure needs information from local governments and other entities. This product could also be used by the local government as a reporting and public communication tool. The focus of this project was to prove that such a tool could be developed using existing software products. The project was successful and the Washington Infrastructure Information Portal (WIIP) includes a portal for inputting capital needs data, a reporting function and a mapping feature. Included in Governor Inslee's 2014 Supplemental Operating Budget request (HB 2185 / SB 6002) is \$250,000 to complete this tool and to conduct the needs assessment.

Three options to view project data:

- (1) Scroll down the page to select the jurisdiction you are interested in.
- (2) Hover your mouse over a project number on the map.
- (3) Type in a jurisdiction name plus "WA" in the search bar.
